

Treatment Efficacy of Multiple Family Narrative Therapy for Chinese Families of Children with Dyslexia: a Randomized Controlled Trial

Abstract

Parent-child conflict has been a hot issue for those families with children having dyslexia in Hong Kong. Dr. Simon Chan would share his current GRF project which will test the efficacy of a unique intervention that integrates family-oriented evidence-informed treatment of Multiple Family Therapy and Narrative Therapy in a field-tested brief treatment approach. It is hypothesized that the Multiple Family Narrative Therapy intervention will help reduce the psychological distress of parents and children and build healthy parent-child relationships. A randomized controlled trial design supplemented by qualitative interviews will be used to evaluate the overall effectiveness of Multiple Family Narrative Therapy. Both quantitative and qualitative results would be shared and its impact to those families would be discussed. This study will add empirical evidence on the effectiveness of Multiple Family Narrative Therapy. Particularly, it will assess culturally relevant components adapted for Chinese Families with Children having Dyslexia.

Biography

Dr. Simon Chan has centered his research on family therapy, SENs-dyslexia, SENs-ADHD and gender studies. He also serves as the Managing Editor of a highly reputable journal *Research on Social Work Practice*, to apply his research skills to evaluate the merit of journal submissions. In addition, he has been actively contributing to be an editorial board member of *Qualitative Social Work* and *Psychology of Men and Masculinities*. Dr. Chan is a robust social work leader in direct practice and research management in administrative leadership. He is a registered counselor, a registered social worker, a certified marriage and family therapist, and a certified supervisor in practice.
